CSX Names D'Aniello Institute for Veterans and Military Families as Workforce Development Partner Under Pride in Service Initiative

(Syracuse, New York) - CSX, one of the nation's leading transportation companies, has added the D'Aniello Institute for Veterans and Military Families (IVMF) at Syracuse University as a workforce development partner for its [Pride in Service program](#). Pride in Service is the company's signature community investment initiative aimed at supporting and strengthening the military, veteran and first responder communities across its 26-state service territory. The IVMF will work alongside [CSX](#) and its other nonprofit partners focused on workforce development, bridging community divides, social, emotional, and mental health, as well as financial and food insecurity.

CSX provided grant funding for the IVMF national Onward to Opportunity (O2O) program, which is a free career training and certification curriculum designed to assist veterans, active-duty service members, and military spouses with civilian workforce preparation. The online and in-person program provides training in a range of high-demand fields, including information technology, project management, and human resources with [40+ industry-recognized certifications](#) available at no cost for eligible participants.

The O2O program is the only veteran-focused career training program [evaluated by a third party](#), validating evidence-based benefits to participants and employers. The program was evaluated at Penn State University Military Clearinghouse and determined O2O graduates, on average, earn \$7,000 more a year on starting salaries than those non-O2O participants. For enlisted service members, which comprise nearly 82% of the armed forces, the results were more impactful with O2O participants earning \$13,000 or more in starting salaries.

CSX is proud to be recognized as one of the top military employers in the country and nearly one in five CSX employees has served in some capacity. From various corporate roles to field positions to CSX's own internal police force and HAZMAT

teams, CSX actively seeks out veterans to strengthen the rail company's workforce for the future.

"As a military friendly employer, CSX understands the valued experience and technical skills that service members bring to the logistics and transportation industry, and we are eager to have them on the ONE CSX team," said Diana Sorfleet, CSX executive vice president and chief administrative officer. "We're excited to partner with IVMF to deepen our support for military connected individuals and help them prepare for successful transition into the workforce."

Since its launch in 2015, the O2O program has reached more than 76,000 participants. CSX's donation will support O2O's ongoing success in empowering transitioning service members, veterans and military spouses in achieving their career goals during life after service.

"We are pleased to officially join CSX in their commitment to the military community through their Pride in Service program," said Michael Bianchi, IVMF's Senior Director for Education and Career Training. "This partnership will help the IVMF continue to deliver impactful career training opportunities for our nation's service members, veterans, and their spouses within high impact communities where CSX operates."

CSX employs a full-time, dedicated military recruiter and has an active Military Business Resource Group made up of military-connected employees that help support retention by providing mentorship, shared experiences, tools and resources among members and the broader community.
